What is the Service Coordinator Program?

What Services does the program provide?

The Service Coordinator Program offers 6 basic services to Public Housing residents:

- Elderly Services
- Health Care Referrals

What is the Service Coordinator's Role?

The Service Coordinator provides informal counseling, plans educational programs, coordinates employment, education, and volunteers opportunities, establishes linkages with outside service agencies, and negotiates affordable services as needed. The Service Coordinator also educates residents on available services, develops contacts with service providers and agencies for resident referrals, and monitors provision of services.

The Services Coordinator works with the Housing Manager to provide and maintain affordable, descent and safe housing. They work together to assist residents to maintain lease compliancy, empower residents to be independent, and assist in building solidarity within the public housing community.
